# New chiropractic clinic honors dad

Douglas and Susan Stewart opened the Joint, a chiropractic clinic, on Market Street in December.

The Stewarts dedicated the clinic – the first of four Joint clinics they plan to open in The Woodlands – to Douglas' father, Richard, who passed away in October 2012. Richard Stewart was a strong proponent of chiropractic care, crediting it with the remission of his scleroderma, a chronic, autoimmune disease that causes the hardening of connective tissues.

When Stewart was young, his father was diagnosed and given only three months to live. He suffered from a range of symptoms, including internal bleeding. After doctors sent him home to live out his final

days, Stewart took a family member's advice and sought chiropractic care from his cousin.
